

ARTS QUEENSLAND APRIL SMALL GRANTS ROUND RECIPIENTS

The successful Small Grants round recipients, who share in \$41,207 towards the costs of their projects, are:

Melissa Forbes, Fortitude Valley, \$4,884 towards the recording, mixing, mastering and manufacturing of a CD of original compositions and arrangements.

Huguette Brassine Collective, Peregian Beach, \$2,492 to produce a master recording of Baroque music for consideration by international distributors.

Sarah Knox, Morningside, \$1,250, for violin tuition in London with Professor Yossi Zivoni.

Rosanna Licari, Annerley, \$4,999 for the creation of a collection of 40 poems entitled *an afternoon with cars*.

Madonna Rogerson Collective, Cooran, \$4,998 for *Pomona's Enchanted Cavalcade*, an outdoor evening performance involving a visual spectacle, musical performance and procession.

Majena Mafe, McDowell, \$3,275 to attend the experimental Narrative Writing workshop to be held in Fresno, California.

Roy McIvor, Hopevale, \$4,999 for the production and exhibition of 10 original paintings.

Ralph Norman, Palm Island, \$4,825 for Indigenous band, Palm Island Wanderers, to perform at Cultural Fest.

Rosewood Railway Museum (Australian Railway Historical Society Queensland Division), Ashwell, \$4,923 for preservation work on the CLV580 vintage train.

Grant Stevens, Petrie Terrace, \$4,562 to travel to Melbourne to produce and present a new three-screen video and sound installation for the *Octopus 5* exhibition at Gertrude Contemporary Art Spaces in July.
