

ARTS QUEENSLAND JULY SMALL GRANTS ROUND RECIPIENTS

The successful recipients of the latest Small Grants round, sharing in \$35,955 towards the costs of their projects, are:

Barbara Fordham, Fortitude Valley, \$4,859 for the creative development of a new musical theatre work entitled Today Again, featuring the songs of Paul Kelly.

Elise Greig, Holland Park, \$4,999 to rehearse The Romany Project, a one-woman play that explores artistic identity and Romany ethnicity from a uniquely Queensland perspective.

Christopher Howlett, Kelvin Grove, \$4,999 to exhibit a multi-media installation on the theme of war, entitled Weapons on the Wall at the Institute of Modern Art in Brisbane.

Julie McGonigal, Coorparoo, \$4,610 to compile a folk CD for launch at the 2004 Woodford Folk Festival.

Shane Nicholson, Margate, \$4,800 to tour the US as the supporting artist for internationally renowned performer Kasey Chambers.

Elizabeth Woods, Doonan, \$4,999 to produce a catalogue for her work, Ephemeral Sensory Walk, in Perigueux, France.

Arilla Paper, Mt Isa, \$4,980 for six Indigenous members of the Arilla Paper collective to participate in the opening of an exhibition of their work at the Creative Queensland Gallery.
