

ARTS QUEENSLAND MAY SMALL GRANTS ROUND RECIPIENTS

The successful recipients of the latest Small Grants round, who share in \$31,507 towards the costs of their projects, are:

Canticum Chamber Choir Inc, Brisbane, \$4,999 to commission composer Gerard Brophy to write a new work entitled Capricornia to be performed at the World Symposium on Choral Music in Kyoto, Japan.

Tamlin Heathwood, West End, \$3,022 to attend The Sunera Foundation in Sri Lanka for a three-week residency with Wolfgang Stange who will train emerging arts workers to work with young people experiencing disability and disadvantage.

Claire Marshall, Annerley, \$4,800 to create and present Pop Trash, a dance theatre work of six short pieces.

Monster Blonde Circus, Auchenflower, \$4,011 to tour the production Love Attack to Europe from August to October 2004.

Redcliffe Opportunities for Peoples Enhancement Assoc Inc (ROPE), \$4,926 for the creation of new performance and design involving young people from Redcliffe and Scarborough with an intellectual disability.

GlassHouse, Brassall, \$4,750, to undertake an intensive month-long skills development program with music producer, Roger Sommers.

YWCA of Toowoomba Inc, \$4,999, for eight young people to receive community cultural development training through the creation of a forum theatre performance on issues surrounding Schoolies Week.
