

ARTS QUEENSLAND SMALL GRANTS ROUND RECIPIENTS

The successful September 2003 Small Grants round recipients, who share in \$26,718 funding towards the costs of their projects are:

Alexandra Gillespie, Norman Park, \$4,200 towards costs to research, present and document an interactive installation that will be exhibited from 7 April to 17 May at Queensland University of Technology's Creative Industries Precinct.

Lifeline Brisbane, \$4,260, to pay professional fees for the production of the *Alifiah...Freedom* CD featuring original compositions of students from Milpera, Yeronga and Ferny Grove High Schools relating to themes of survival, mutual understanding and welcome.

Royal Flying Doctor Service, \$4,900 to facilitate community arts workshops with the young men of Kowanyama in Far North Queensland.

Shutterspeed, Brisbane, \$3,808 to perform concerts in New Zealand, to promote the work of Shutterspeed as Queensland musicians and to develop an export market for Queensland cultural product.

Cameron Stelzer, Springwood, \$4,400 to produce a new body of installation work to be exhibited at Logan Art Gallery for the month of August 2004.

Warwick Art Gallery, \$2,000 to employ artists to create a month-long outdoor exhibition as part of a new festival in Warwick, *Jumpers and Jazz in July*.

Michael Zavros, Hawthorne, \$3,150 to create new work for a solo exhibition, *Everything I wanted*, held from December 2003 to January 2004 at the Institute of Modern Art and to document the works for a catalogue with a commissioned essay.
