
# Artist in Residence Program Application data 2014

The Artist in Residence Program is a three year partnership (2013 – 2015) between the Australia Council for the Arts and the Queensland Government (Arts Queensland in the Department Science, Information Technology, Innovation and the Arts and Department of Education, Training and Employment).

### How many people applied?

The Artist in Residence Program 2014 involved a twopart application process. 92 expressions of interest (EOI) were received. 24, or 26%, of these applications progressed to full application stage. Of the 24 full proposal applications, 12, or 50%, were successful in acquiring investment funding.



#### Who applied?

79% of full proposal applications came from Queensland schools. A further 17% were submitted by Queensland Government approved kindergarten program providers and 4% by tertiary institutions.

Queensland schools had the largest percentage of successful applications (75%), followed by Queensland Government approved kindergarten program providers (17%) and tertiary institutions (8%).

#### How much?

The total final amount requested by applicants who progressed to the full proposal application stage was \$445,994.

\$230,000 was invested in 12 residencies across 16 Queensland school communities.
